



2025 Fees Schedule

Tuition Fees

Listed below are the Good News Lutheran College (GNLC) 2025 Tuition Fees applicable for each year level. The GNLC Board determines and reviews these fees on an annual basis. All fees quoted are per student. Any student enrolling to commence during the year is charged Tuition Fees on a pro-rata basis according to the weeks remaining in the year. Annual Fee Statements will be issued to families before the commencement of the school year.

Technology and ICT

To support learning, all students are provided with a personal device and monitored internet access for use during their time studying at the College. For students in Years P-9, a touchscreen

tablet is supplied. In Years 10-12, a laptop is issued and maintained for students by the College. Whilst enrolled at the College, the students can take their laptops home to ensure ongoing access to schoolwork. This also affords the student the opportunity to exercise responsibility and authentically helps them to take control of their learning whilst enriching their schooling experience.

Inclusions and Additional Charges

Items Included in Annual Tuition Fees

- Excursions and year-level camps that are compulsory and considered part of the curriculum
- iPad is provided for students in Prep-Year 9
- Laptop for students in Years 10-12
- Textbooks and/or online subscriptions and essential stationery for students in Years Prep-6

Additional Costs

- School Uniform
- Textbooks and/or online subscriptions for VCE students and Year 7-12 students
- Camps for elective subjects and extra-curricular activities (this includes Duke of Edinburgh, HPV Racing Team, Outdoor Education and Overseas Cultural Immersion)
- College Bus Service
- Private Music Tuition/Lessons
- Canteen
- Before and After School Care and Vacation Care Programs
- VET subjects are partially subsidised

Voluntary Building Fund Donation

A voluntary Building Fund donation of \$300 per family is requested to assist with the various capital works of the College. This payment is tax deductible.

Payment of Fees

GNLC charges tuition fees in full at the start of the year and Fee Statements are issued prior to the commencement of each term and at the end of each month. While some families choose to pay their fees in one lump sum at the start of the year, a payment plan can be arranged to pay tuition fees by direct debit instalments either fortnightly or monthly over a 10-month period between January and October. The minimum expectation is that by the end Week 2 in Term 1, at least 25% of the fees have been paid, by the end of Week 2 in Term 2, at least 50% of the fees have been paid, by the end of week 2 in Term 3, at least 75% of the fees have been paid, and by the end of week 2 in Term 4, the account has been fully paid. Failure to meet these dates may result in students being unenrolled.

Early Payment Discount

For fees paid in full by the end of Week 2 in Term 1 a 2.5% discount will apply.

Fees can be paid using the following methods:

Direct Debit (Preferred Method)

A Direct Debit form will be provided with the initial account statement, prior to the commencement of Term 1 2025.

BPAY

Each family has a unique BPAY Customer Reference number. This is located on the front of the annual and term fee statement. Good News Lutheran College's Biller Code is 229740.

EFTPOS

The College has EFTPOS facilities available for payments made in person at the College.

Late Fees

Due to administrative costs incurred in following up outstanding fees, a charge of \$95 will be applied for late payments or where agreed arrangements are not adhered to.

Student Withdrawal or Exit

One full term's notice must be given, in writing, to the Admissions Officer when a student withdraws voluntarily from the College. If not received, one term's fee will be charged to the fee account. One term's notice is from the last school day of the previous term to the end of the term in which the student is withdrawing, in accordance with the published school dates, excluding school holiday periods.
